Now that winter is officially over, and the town has recovered from its High Street being closed for three weeks, it is time to look forward to plans and challenges that face the Town. There is no doubt the biggest challenge facing us all is the withdrawal of the Mid Devon District Council service from the Market Street offices. The Town Council has been in long negotiations trying to mitigate the changes as best it can. To help in this quest it has appointed a receptionist who will be able to advise and guide people following the closure.

The Town Council has been looking at the possibility of taking over the council building and has appointed Catalyst Consultancy to carry out a feasibility study. This will help to define the aims and objectives for the building and devise a business plan for how these can be achieved.

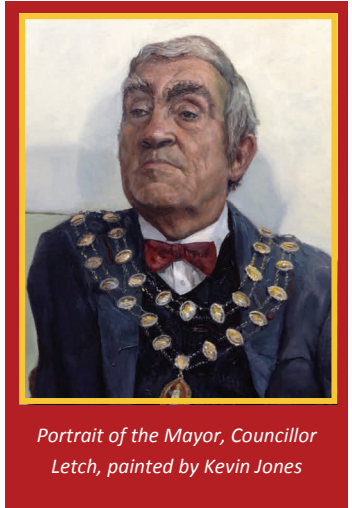
This year's Mayor's Reception will be on 20th April. Charities and other groups from the town will gather to network and receive grants from the Council to help them carry on their good work. There

will also be the presentation of the town plate, which recognises the efforts of those demonstrating outstanding commitment to Credition.

I shall continue with my Mayor's surgeries on the Town Square and look forward to people coming over to chat. Some have positive ideas, some have mild criticisms - all are welcome.

The Wildlife Area and Scout Memorial Garden continue to flourish and enliven Peoples Park. I shall have entry forms at my surgeries and there are other outlets in the town where they can be collected.

Floral Crediton Past & Present

Floral Crediton was established in the late 1980's by Cllr. Gillian Ponsford. She soon had a team of dedicated volunteers including Joyce Harris, Jenni and Dave Pitts, Nan and John Gaskell, Eddie Sherwood and Norman Ponsford. They started to 'green up' the town. They planted wishing wells at the entrances, held a gardening competition for residents, established the plant-a-boot competition at Haywards School, which at its peak had 70 boots, and entered Crediton in Britain in Bloom ("BIB").

Starting in 1963, BIB now consists of 18 regions including the Channel Islands and Isle of Man and has been organised by the RHS since 2002. It is designed as a ladder for groups to climb from the grassroots level of "It's Your Neighbourhood" ("IYN") to the Pennant Award and then BIB.

In 1992, Crediton received the South West Travel Association Cup for the best town in the "4,500 - 10,000 population" category. This was Crediton's fourth year of entry in BIB, having won a Certificate in the same category in 1990. In 1996, Crediton was awarded the Abbiss Certificate for Excellence.



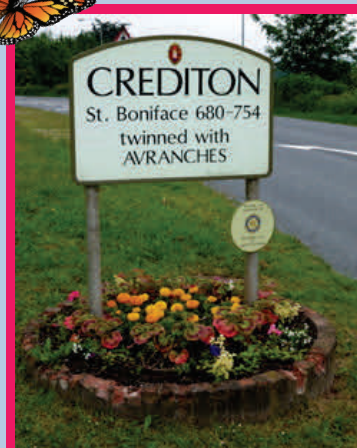

In 2011, Crediton entered BIB and earned the South West Tourism Cup, Silver Award. In 2012, the Crediton Congregational Church entered the IYN Award, which consists of non-competitive, volunteer-led groups, who clean up or 'green up' local areas. By 2015, 18 groups including the Railway station, Town Square Garden, Peoples Park and the Wildlife Garden, Bowls Club, Hillbrow Residential Home, Hayward's Garden Club, Landscore School, Lennard House Gardeners, Newcombes Meadow Community Group, Moffats Land Allotments, Lions Club, Age Concern, Rotary Boniface, Residents Stanbury Court, the Lodge residents and Save the House Martins, had entered, which has built a solid foundation of support for entry into the Pennant Award this year. The criterion for this award is more relaxed than the BIB criteria allocating 25% for Community Participation, 25% for Environmental Responsibility, and 50% for Gardening Achievement.

The Floral Crediton competition, allowing residents to showcase their gardens and receive valuable feedback from judge, Bert Jewell, is thriving and last year had over 25 entries!

The council has agreed to enter the Pennant Award this year and the judges will visit on July 4th. As chairman of the committee, I aim to support the town community volunteers in their effort to attain Gold level recognition for Crediton at Regional, National, and European levels, because 'green' streets: encourage people to linger longer (helping local businesses to thrive), bond communities together (restoring pride and reducing anti-social behaviour), and create a prosperous and unified community.

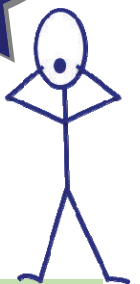


Did you know the Town Council is consulted on every planning application within Crediton Town? Did you also know that you are able to comment on planning applications? Our town will always be affected by development and it is important that as residents and businesses you use the channels available to make your voice heard and have your say.

Last year we received an application for Wellparks to be developed. Recently, we received an application for development at Fordton and coming soon will be proposals for Pedlerspool and an Anaerobic Digestion Plant at Lords Meadow. All planning applications have to be submitted to Mid Devon District Council, as the Local Planning Authority. These can be found on their website and in the local press.

Crediton Town Council considers these applications at its monthly council meeting, with each application listed on the agenda (copies can be found on our website). You can comment by writing or e-mailing Mid Devon District Council and/or you can make your views known to your local Town Councillor, who will make sure these are taken into account when the Town Council considers the application.
