The project, started by Crediton Town Council, has now become a huge community project, involving Community Payback, Newton St Cyres Young Farmers Club, members of Crediton Incredible Edibles project, local businesses and now children from both Crediton Primary Schools.


The children were helping by making cosy bug hotels to encourage wildlife to the area. We think they did an excellent job!

The town council is asking residents if they can donate specific plants, including, Elder, Raspberry, Butterfly bush, Flowering currant, Berberis, Winter flowering Honeysuckle, Mahonia, Holly, Bloody Cranesbill, Carex, Woodrush, Teasel, Cardoon, Chamomile, Honesty, Evening Primrose, Foxglove, Jacob's Ladder, Shield Fern, Sweet Cicely, Greater Celandine, Creeping Rosemary, English Bluebells, Cyclamen and Hart's- tongue Fern, in readiness for the big planting day being held on Saturday, 11th April, where everyone is welcome to come and help!

Parking the loading bay issue!



The dual purpose loading bays in Crediton have caused much anger and frustration over the past years. After a long and hard-fought campaign, mostly with Devon County Highways, the town council has at last achieved a major concession from the Minister and officers of the Department for Transport.

The loading bays, which are dual purpose, can now be differently marked and larger signs can be put up. This includes increasing the size of all lettering. This should take away the ambiguity that now exists and make the life of the motorist that much easier. The town council is now pursuing the new markings with Devon County Highways.

Crediton Gives & Takes

Sustainable Crediton's Waste Action Group undertook a unique event in Crediton High Street in February. A Give and Take event where people gave away their unwanted, but perfectly usable goods which could then be taken away free of charge by others.

Funding was secured from the Devon County Council Locality fund and Awards for All to cover costs for premises, publicity and other expenses, but all the labour was provided completely free of charge by over 40 volunteers.

Crediton's Mayor opened the shop on the High Street, on 6th February, to a queue of about 40 people waiting outside! By the end of the first day over 500 people had been to the shop, many bringing goods to donate, but others just coming to shop for the five free items they could take away every day. Everything from baby clothes & toys to curtains, CDs, DVDs, books, china, ornaments and small electrical items was given, including a kitchen sink!

By the time the exhausted volunteers closed the doors, 14 days later, over 7,700 people had visited. More than 7,000kg of goods had also been donated, with over 95% of them finding good new homes. Paula Mossman, from Sustainable Crediton's Waste Action Group said "The people of Crediton took the project to their hearts. It was an unqualified success".

In March the Tesco bus stopped; we now face the threat of losing our town bus service and main road buses after 8.00 pm. We are told that these buses are not financially viable, as there are not enough passengers and resulting revenue. So the answer is simple, use it or lose it.

There are plans to radically alter the library service, cutting £1.5 million from the budget. If you don't wish to lose this invaluable service in the future, then you must start using it now. A new group, Friends of Crediton Library, launched officially on February 7th with a promotional stand at the Farmers' Market, and an event featuring FabLab with its 3D printer from Exeter Central Library, alongside a cake sale in the library. In fact, the 3D printer generated so much interest that they will try to have it back for a workshop day in the future. Town, District and County Councillors were there to support the event, and have continued to offer practical help and encouragement.

The aims of the group are -

- to raise the profile of the library through events and other activities
- to increase membership, borrowing and visiting totals for the library
- to raise money for specific library purposes
- to offer voluntary assistance to the library as and when it may be required
- to liaise with other groups of Friends and with Devon libraries

Neighbourhood Plan update

Between January and March, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering group distributed surveys to households and businesses throughout the town. More than 1200 household responses were received; almost 400 school students responded online and 300 school pupils gave their views. Volunteers have recorded the data and opinions electronically.

The data and opinions collected have been professionally analysed with a report being produced in April. The report will guide the steering group in producing policies for future development. Although the allocation of sites has already been done through the district council's Local Plan, the Neighbourhood Plan will add detail.

The steering group expects to produce a draft plan for consultation in early summer. This will be widely publicised with opportunities for local people to comment before the policies are finalised.
