Peoples Park Report - let's talk about projects!

Question - What are our projects?

Now that Peoples Park has a "new" noticeboard it seems proper that we use it to promote projects that we are interested in. Do we agree with this?

Currently, we are displaying a map from the MDDC "Credition MasterPlan", that has the enhanced cycling and walking route - from the square to the train station. Is this a project that we wish to develop? If yes, then...

Question - How are we going to develop this project? Community Committee?

Certainly, any environmental project will need to be worked on in collaboration with local groups, including Sustainable Credition. In addition, we should draw on the information that we have gathered from our Community Conversations. So far so good, but...

Questions - How are we planning for the future, 50 years from now? How are we taking into consideration climate change?

According to the Met Office, in 50 years time, the climate is projected to be significantly warmer and more extreme, with summer temperatures regularly exceeding 30°C and 40°C in the UK. Winters will be warmer and up to 30-45% wetter, while summers will be up to 60% drier, increasing risks of both flash flooding and severe droughts.

Will our High Street not need trees to protect us from the heat? It takes 50 years for most trees to provide this level of shade. What if anything is agreed? But also...

Question - How are we countering the loss of biodiversity?

I have visited two new woodland planting sites, close to the upgraded Okehampton rail line. Network Rail have planted these two fields to provide a habitat for the native dormouse. Known as the UK hazel dormouse, its population has declined by approximately 70% since 2000. These mammals are threatened by habitat loss, fragmentation, and climate change. This is a "50 year project" that aims for an increase in the numbers of dormice in this area of Devon.

So are we planning for the future - 50 years ahead?

These are the issues and projects that I hope that our Community Committee will address in the next council year.

Recommendation

1. Purpose

1.1 This report provides recommendations made by selected councillors, following agreement by Full Council to undertake a survey regarding Newcombes Meadow Paddling Pool.

2. Background

- 2.1 Consideration has been given to the way in which the survey will be conducted; there will be an online form, with paper copies made available at Credition Library, Redlands and Adams. Posters will also be added to relevant locations.
- 2.2 A press release will be provided to the Credition Courier. The survey will be conducted in-house.
- 2.3 Consideration has been given to the information about the survey and the questions. (Appendix 1).
- 2.4 Full Council has previously resolved to offer 3 x £50 vouchers.

Newcombes Meadow Water Play Survey

Crediton Town Council has been working with Mid Devon District Council to consider the future of water play in Newcombes Meadow. The existing paddling pool, which has reached the end of its life, needs replacing.

We have been reviewing how it's currently run, how much it costs to maintain, and what options there might be for its future.

We know that a paddling pool will be expensive and most of the money spent would be on its operation and not on an improved facility. CTC has decided that it cannot commit funds to its refurbishment and ongoing maintenance, as they are too high and it would not be sustainable.

We are investigating the installation of a splashpad, which would be inclusive, safer, we believe would be more sustainable, and ultimately cheaper to both install and run (the installation costs are approximately £270,000, with a contribution of approximately £62,000 from CTC).

We know that residents have previously wanted toilet facilities closer to the play area, and we want to work with MDDC and use Section 106 money (received from housing developers to MDDC to mitigate their impact and support community services and assets) to deliver this, alongside water play.

Before any decisions are made, we want to hear from the people who matter most - Crediton residents and Crediton Town Council precept payers.

This short survey is your chance to tell us what you think. Whether you use the paddling pool regularly, occasionally, or not at all, your views will help us to better understand what the community wants and values.

The feedback we receive will be shared with councillors and used to help guide future decisions about the paddling pool.
