Chairman's Report

Cllr Frank Letch MBE, Mayor & Chairman for 2020-2021

This municipal year has been like no other and mostly because of the covid virus. As members of the public will realise the office has been shut throughout the year and all meetings have been held virtually using zoom.

This has also meant that many of our activities have had to be put on the shelf. There has been no garden competition, allotment judging and Christmas in Crediton live Switch-on event.

We were even unable to run the annual Service of Remembrance but we did manage a small act of recognition at the war memorial on the Sunday and the following Tuesday.

The staff have worked very hard to maintain as normal a service as possible. They have prepared a number of excellent newsletters which have been on display outside the town council building in a large red box. On behalf of all councillors I would like to thank our staff for going the extra mile in carrying out their duties. I would also like to thank the residents of Crediton for being understanding in these difficult times.

Committee Reports 2020-2021

The following reports give an overview of the activities of each Crediton Town Council Committee & Sub-Committee for the past year. Each report has been written by the Committee Chair or Clerk.

Town Strategy - Cllr Liz Brookes Hocking

This committee comments on planning applications for developments within the town and on plans for the wider area that affect Crediton. It is overseeing the completion of the Neighbourhood Plan.

It also discusses ideas and initiatives for community action and activities within the town. In the last year, these have included:

- the feasibility of taking on Old Landscore School for community use
- an increased commitment to youth work
- a CCTV system for the town centre
- taking on the Newcombes Meadow toilets from the district council
- supporting cultural events and social facilities in the town square when restrictions allow
- reviewing and restarting the Climate Change and Sustainability Sub-committee

Virtual meetings have enabled this committee to continue its work, though at a slower pace because of restrictions preventing on-site meetings and discussions with contractors. However, staff have persevered and by the end of the year had gathered enough advice, information and reports for councillors to be able to make the decision to purchase Old Landscore School. Previous users and new ones are keen to use the building as soon as it can be safely permitted with appropriate facilities. Getting the building useable again will be a priority before we look at options for refurbishing the building for its long-term future as a centre for community groups and services.

Council Affairs Committee - Cllr Joyce Harris

The Council Affairs Committee is responsible for determining the resource requirements of the town council and making recommendations to council. This includes land and property, employees and contracts. In addition to this, the committee oversees the training requirements of councillors and staff, the policies and procedures of the town council, its publicity and public relations, any legal proceedings, electoral matters, insurance arrangements and civic events. Finally it also scrutinises, when required, town council activities and decisions.

Our new clerk, Rachel Avery, joined us in June and as we were in the middle of a pandemic it was a challenging time for her. She is the line manager for the three members of staff who were working from home and she was not able to meet them face to face when she first took over. Rachel has done an amazing job in difficult circumstances and we are pleased she has settled into her role so well. The Town Clerk has also started the process for the town council to attain Quality Gold status in the Local Council Award Scheme.

Two of the office staff are undertaking further training. The Administrative Assistant has passed four modules in the 'Introduction to Local Council Administration' and the Projects Officer is undertaking an Open University course in Project Management.

Assets and Amenities Committee – Cllr Joyce Harris

The Assets & Amenities Committee is responsible for overseeing all town council owned and leased open spaces, parks, gardens and play areas. All town council owned/maintained property is regularly inspected by staff with work carried out when necessary. This also includes essential tree works. Following a recent inspection of trees on town council land, work has been carried out at Peoples Park and Stonypark to ensure the safety of the public and allow the park and its wildlife to thrive.

The committee accepted an offer from a local resident to repair the fingerpost that was damaged at the top of Jockey Hill. After the Boniface Statue was covered in graffiti, it was agreed to investigate the possibility of getting a Portland Stone specialist to apply antigraffiti sealant. It was also agreed that the current defibrillator scheme will be renewed for a further four years.

The committee also oversees the cleaning of the bus shelters, the supply and filling of grit bins and will be responsible for all benches in the town. We have also agreed to take over the supply and planting of summer bedding at the East Street/Charlotte Street junction, the Union Road wall and beds near the St Boniface Statue following Mid Devon District Council's withdrawal of the service.

The town council has over 130 allotments spread over three sites. The Administrative Assistant along with the Chair of the Boniface Allotments Association regularly inspect the allotments providing updates at each Committee meeting.

The Committee is also responsible for coordinating the provision of floral displays within the Town and overseeing and promoting the Floral Crediton Competition.

We are fortunate to have several volunteers and community groups in Crediton who are committed to making the town looks its best. Whether it be litter picking, weed killing or looking after the flower beds, planters and wildlife areas, we really couldn't achieve so much without them.

Climate Change and Sustainability Committee – Rachel Avery, Town Clerk

Up to lockdown, the Climate Change and Sustainability Sub-Committee operated without a full-time clerk or administration services. During this year, the committee reviewed its arrangements and now the town council has agreed to upgrade it from a sub-committee to a committee serviced by the Town Clerk and reporting directly to the full Town Council.

The committee met for the first time in April, with Cllr Paul Vincent being elected as Chairman. Working within a new set of Terms of Reference, it is hoped that the committee will be able to assess town council policy to reflect a determination to deal with climate change and facilitate the community in achieving a lower carbon footprint.

Parish Paths Sub-Committee – Emma Anderson, Assistant Clerk

The Parish Paths Committee met three times during the year to discuss the general condition of the paths in and around the town and agree any actions/repairs required. With the help of PROW officer Mrs Ros Davies, the Committee aims to ensure that all footpaths are in good condition and accessible for all to enjoy.

Between December and February, committee members head out to inspect the footpaths in order to complete the annual surveys. Accessibility is checked as well as the need for any repairs, such as fallen gates. The town council is always open to local walkers reporting any problems they have on our footpaths and one of the best ways to do this is via Devon County Council's online Report It system. These reports are sent directly to Crediton's local footpath warden, with a site visit being carried out as soon as possible to assess the problem.

The Committee recently agreed to hold the annual anniversary event of the Redvers Ramble walk later in the year. This will be taking place on Saturday 19 June 2021, subject to covid guidelines at the time. Please check our website and social media pages for updates.

You can also expect to see a new Crediton Footpaths Facebook page appearing soon! The launch of this Facebook page was agreed at the last meeting, where members wanted to provide fellow walkers with a space to share walks, report problems and generally share their experiences of Crediton's many footpaths.

The Grants Sub-Committee met in November 2020 where members discussed and allocated the majority of the grants made for the financial year 2021/22. A second meeting was held in January 2021 when the rest of the grants were allocated. The total amount allocated for 2021/22 so far is £23,759.95, representing 7% of the town council's total precept.

The committee looks very carefully at the previous year's report from the applicants and makes sure the grants awarded will benefit the people of Crediton. In this very difficult year, it has been ever more pressing for the town council to make these payments to help several organisations carry on their much-needed services within the town.

Britain in Bloom Update – Cllr Mike Szabo

Last year all the entries into Britain in Bloom (BIB) were rolled over into 2021. So, Crediton has 24 entries into the It's Your Neighbourhood (IYN) programme, including both primary schools, and the town itself is entered into the Pennant award competition.

The judges will visit Crediton sometime in July and assess the town and organisations on Community participation, Environmental responsibility, and Gardening achievement and then give constructive feedback and support to all participating organisations.

The Awards Presentation will take place in Western Super Mare on 7 October and Crediton will host a local Awards Presentation the following week.
