With loyal, local sponsor Ashgrove Kitchens, we proudly present Credition Food Festival. It is still completely free to attend, with free demos all day, and free children's entertainment. The festival takes over the Town Square, Market Street, AND Parliament Street.



There are 40 stalls - from veg boxes, milkshakes and cider, to burgers, doughnuts and brownies. The emphasis is on local producers so expect Devon honey, Devon vodka and Devon flowers.

Adults will enjoy free talks and tastes all day: cider and cheese pairing, two different curry demos and delicious sorbet. Kids (and big kids) will enjoy 'The Imaginarium' entertainment tent, walkabout chefs on stilts and craft by Credition Youth Service.

While the vast majority of the UK public accepts that climate change is happening, a small but notable percentage do not. YouGov data indicates that 84% of Britons believe the climate is changing. However, about 4% explicitly do not believe in climate change and around 17% believe it's happening but not due to human activity.



Crediton Town Council (CTC) accepted the climate and biodiversity crisis in 2019. I joined CTC on Tuesday 19th July 2022 on the day that the UK experienced record-breaking temperatures that reached over 40°C and the Government declared a national emergency following the Met Office's first ever issuance of a red 'extreme heat' warning. Making changes can take time and so I'm delighted that after a couple of years in the planning, our park, Peoples Park, is managed differently in order to help tackle climate change.

According to a survey by Crediton Matters, 82% support the changes in Peoples Park, saying that it's good for nature and the bigger picture. Interestingly, this figure is close to the 84% that accept climate change. For me it's now time to engage local people in other areas that will likewise tackle climate change and I hope to gain more of your support. Thanks for your understanding.




