What a hopeful couple of months it has been! Saturday, Sixteenth of January saw the opening of the first COVID vaccination clinic in Crediton. With several clinics organised since then, vaccinations have been successfully administered to the top four priority categories in Crediton and the surrounding area.

The clinics are staffed by volunteers and Crediton Town Council has worked closely with Richard Ward, Chiddenbrook Practice Manager, to recruit members of the community to help support what is a vital service for the people of Mid Devon. Councillors have been delighted to give their time to contribute to such a worthwhile cause.

A full clinic day usually provides over 1,000 vaccines and without the support of every volunteer, this fantastic achievement would not have been possible.

New Committee Structure

Due to responsibilities increasing and diversifying, the council is now at a point where a restructure is required. Crediton Town Council 2021/22 Budget - What does this mean for you?

What does Crediton Town Council provide for residents and how is your money spent?

Maintenance of Public Open Spaces, including Peoples Park and Upper Deck, continued allotment provision, seasonal bedding at the Town Square, St Lawrence Green and Newcombes Meadow, grass verge cutting, footpath maintenance and street furniture maintenance.

A brand new CCTV system for Crediton High Street, Town Square and Newcombes Meadow.

Annual 'Christmas in Crediton', Remembrance Sunday, and other community events.

Strategic Planning for the future of the town including post-Covid recovery and the ongoing development of council policy.

Provision of community facilities and infrastructure, including Newcombes Meadow toilet block and Old Landscore School.

Grant funding to community groups/organisations (2021/22 grant budget of £27,500).

Crediton Town Council's precept (paid directly to us as a percentage of your council tax) has been set at £325,197 from April 2021 to March 2022, an increase of 24.2% on last year. In real terms, this equates to an increase of £2.03 a month per Band D household.

What does £2.03 buy... one takeaway coffee or a box of cereal?

A Message from your Town Clerk

As I enter my ninth month as the Town Clerk here in Crediton, I reflect on how challenging this past year has been for many of us; new ways of working, becoming home schooling pros and feeling far more lonely than usual are just a few of the issues that I have faced.

Even with restrictions in place, we were able to organise a poignant Remembrance Sunday event and a successful 'virtual' Christmas light switch on. Recently, we started live streaming our meetings to Facebook. This seems to have been received well, and I would like to thank anyone who has watched our videos, either live or recorded. I feel that this has offered a greater level of inclusivity and transparency, and it is something that we will continue to offer whilst we wait for details on when and how our meetings will return 'in person'. What you may not get to see though, is the behind the scenes work that Crediton Town Council is involved in. Our twelve councillors are supported by myself and three other members of staff, working on a range of issues, projects, plans and initiatives. We deal with the day to day running of the council, but are often in the background on a range of activities. We have supported the employment of a new detached youth worker, are facilitating the seasonal bedding at St Lawrence Green and Newcombes Meadow, and have provided marshalling for Covid vaccinations at Lords Meadow Leisure Centre. 2021 and beyond holds further exciting initiatives including the proposed purchase of Old Landscore School and the renovation of Newcombes Meadow toilet block.

Whilst we are not currently in the office, our 'door' is always open. You can contact us on our usual office number or email us. One of the biggest perks of my job is speaking to the most important people in the town – those who live here.

CCTV - it's happening!

We are thrilled to confirm that the Town Council has approved the installation of a Town Centre CCTV system! After discussing primary needs with the local police, coverage will include the High Street, Town Square, Newcombes Meadow and the War Memorial/toilet block area with the system being made up of 12 cameras, using 7 locations in the town.

With the kind cooperation of landlords and businesses, successful surveys have been carried out with regards to electrical connections in buildings and the next stage will be to carry out some camera demos to ensure optimum views. With the necessary checks in full swing, we hope to have an installation date booked in by the end of March!

With such a large scale project, there are of course large scale costs and we would like to thank the Police & Crime Commissioners Office, Devon County Councillor Nick Way and the East & Mid Devon Community Safety Partnership for recognising the benefits of the project and providing much-needed financial support. Not only that, but we would like to say a huge thank you to the individual traders in the town that have offered their support and contribution to the project in what has been a very difficult year.
