ANNUAL BUDGET 2025-2026

Investing in Crediton and enhancing our community

Who is Crediton Town Council and what do we do?

Crediton Town Council (CTC) sits in the first tier of local government and is the first point of contact for anyone concerned with a community issue.

We look after a range of community facilities including allotments, bus shelters and public open spaces; we organise a range of civic and community events including Christmas in Crediton. CTC also supports local community groups/organisations by providing annual grants.

Following the budgeting workshops held in November, CTC's Oversight Committee spent two months looking at the budget in detail. Ongoing increases have been considered, whilst ensuring the current provision of assets and services is maintained at least to its current standard.

Businesses and contractors have seen increased costs above inflation and the budget set reflects the general increase in costs to services such as grounds maintenance.

CTC recognises that the cost of living continues to rise, but the provision of services that it provides is of high importance to so many Crediton residents. For more info please contact the Town Clerk, Rachel Avery: r.avery@crediton.gov.uk.

Where will our money come from?

CTC's main source of income is from Mid Devon District Council as part of your council tax. This part of your council tax is known as the precept. We use the precept to fund the functions and services Crediton Town Council provides.

Domestic rate payers council tax
£510,750.00 (94% of anticipated income)

SERVICES INCOME

Rent for allotments & room hire
£4,015 (1% of anticipated income)

OTHER INCOME

Income received from grants and interest
£28,000 (5% of anticipated income)

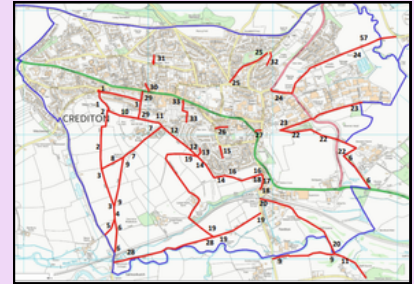
TREE-SPOTTING WALK IN CREDITON

I'm delighted to announce that CTC is holding a competition which promotes the use of our wonderful footpaths. If you would like to enter this competition, please contact me, Councillor Giles Fawssett gawssett@crediton.gov.uk. Crediton has 35 footpaths. I walked every path in numerical order for the town council's annual checks. This took me 6 hours and I met nobody, so I thought this was a good time for a competition! Walking is the cheapest form of transportation. Switching from driving to walking could save a household up to £56.50 a week. A DfT National Survey (2024) reports that 25% of trips today are less than 1 mile.

Our roads have historically cut through traditional footpath routes, and I would like the competition to raise awareness of this. Please send photos of your walks, with details of which number path you walked, and how it saved a drive, or walk all 35 paths and send us photos and your finish time!

WHAT IT'S LIKE TO BE A TOWN COUNCILLOR

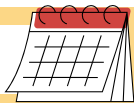
