CAHMS (Crediton and Area History and Museum Society)

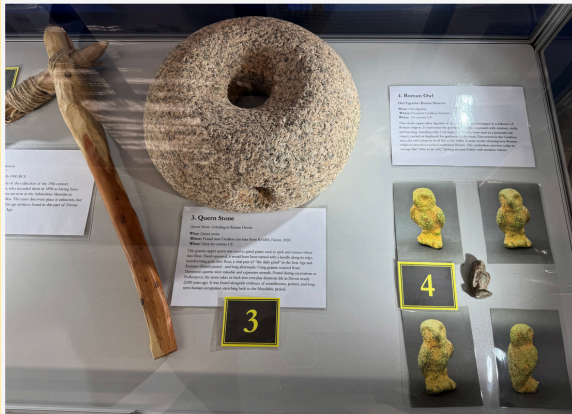

Crediton Arts Centre were awarded £500 towards their concert - **Spring Awakening**. The decision was made to switch focus from the annual Busk IT! to their new venture, the Spring-Awakening Music Festival. It started this year, with performances of folk, jazz, classical, Americana, world music and opera. Throughout the town, indoors and out, it was remarkably successful, playing to an audience of around 1000 people. "We aim to give the whole town a celebratory feeling for the week by placing performances in various locations" said Crediton Arts Centre.

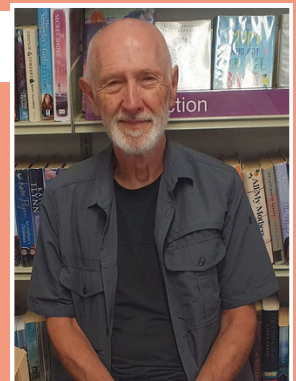

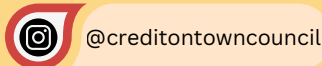
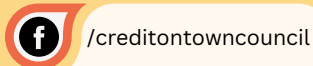
