As we at Crediton Town Council reflect on the passing of Frank Letch MBE, we remember him fondly as a dedicated public servant, a tireless advocate, and a beloved member of our community.

Frank served as Mayor of Crediton from 2008 to 2021, his tenure defined by his ability to bring people together, championing initiatives that fostered inclusivity, and improving the lives of those living in Crediton. His work extended beyond Crediton, as he also served on Mid Devon District Council and Devon County Council, ensuring that local voices were heard at every level of governance.

Frank's advocacy was not limited to local politics. He was deeply involved in charitable work, supporting organisations such as Reach and Devon in Sight.

Frank's contributions to Crediton will not be forgotten. He set an example for all who had the privilege of knowing him. His passing leaves a void in our community, but his legacy will continue to inspire us. As a mark of respect, the Crediton flag was flown at half-mast, and a Book of Condolence is available for those who wish to pay tribute to his memory. 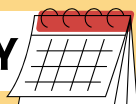
