## A message from the Mayor, Councillor Frank Letch

The Town Council owns 5 plots of land comprising 3 allotment sites, Peoples Park and Stonypark. Through the summer we have been busy improving the Wildlife Area in Peoples Park, inspecting

Stonypark so it could be rented and managing the 3 allotment sites with the help of the Boniface Allotments Association.

Although not financially responsible for the many footpaths around the Town, the Council is part of the Devon County Council Parish Paths Scheme and so several councillors have walked some paths in order to maintain suitable access.



One of the highlights of the year has been accompanying Bert Jewell as he judges the Floral Crediton Competition entries and I judge the Mayor's Favourite garden. Entries this year were good but the hot, dry weather had a significant effect on lawns and some plants!

## **Disputes with Mid Devon District Council**

The Town Council seems to be in a constant dispute with Mid Devon District Council (MDDC). I have no need to write of their sale of the Council Office but you may not know of the two other issues. Trim trails are a popular way of helping people exercise outdoors and the Town Council has been pushing MDDC to install one in Newcombes Meadow. Town Council staff have researched equipment but MDDC appear reluctant to pursue this as a project despite pursuing a similar project in, yes you've guessed it, Tiverton. The other dispute is on behalf of students at Landscore School, who would like to have drinking fountains installed in the Town. The Town Council supports this initiative and has approached MDDC regarding a drinking fountain near Newcombes Meadow play area. Alas, we have been confronted by the usual wall of negativity. ## 100 years of Remembrance

On Sunday, 11th November 2018, Crediton Town Council will be holding a special tribute to mark the day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War.

This year, the Remembrance Sunday Church Service, held at

Crediton Parish Church, will be taking place at 9.30 am. The service has been moved to this time in order that the 2-minute silence held at the War Memorial can be timed to start at 11.00 am.

Later that day, a Battle's Over Tribute event will be held at Beacon Park, Crediton, at 6.30 pm and everyone is welcome to attend. The Mayor of Crediton, Cllr Frank Letch, will open the event at



6.40 pm. Crediton's list of fallen will be read, the last post played, and finally, along with more than 1000 beacons throughout the UK, a beacon will be lit at 7.00 pm in remembrance of the end of the war and the millions who lost their lives or came home wounded.

The event is being organised by Crediton Town Council but we would like to thank the Royal British Legion, Army Cadets, Air Cadets, Scouts, Cubs & Beavers and the local Fire Service for helping with the arrangements.
