This year's Flower Festival, at the Parish Church, included 20 outstanding floral displays, all created by members of our community. The money raised from the festival, from the sale of catalogues and refreshments, helps to keep the church looking so magnificent and contributes significantly to the much needed roof replacement. The annual church festivals are vital to the upkeep of the church, so don't forget to pop along to them - you will not be disappointed.



If you have walked by the Town Square recently, you won't have been able to miss the flourishing displays in every corner. It takes huge amounts of effort to keep these planters looking great all year round and we are sure you would agree that it is well worth it. This year's planting has kindly been sponsored by *Gilbert Stephens LLP*, *Haines Watts*, *The Greenhouse* & *Homeleigh Crediton Garden Centre*. Local gardening expert, Bert Jewell, does a fantastic job planting the Town Square every year. Without Bert's green fingers and the generosity of the local sponsors, the floral displays on the Town Square would not exist!

We hope you have also noticed the colourful hanging baskets that are brightening up the town until the end of September. In previous years these were supplied by Mid Devon District Council, however this year was slightly different. The Town Council faced the challenge of sourcing 38 hanging baskets and 8 hanging troughs, as well as finding a company to water the displays twice a week.

We are pleased to say that thanks to Taunton Deane Nurseries and S.A.J Window Cleaners Ltd, the hanging baskets went up on 1st June and look as vibrant as ever!





Council Office Building Update

Okay, so it's cards on the table time. We didn't get the building. Mid Devon District Council (MDDC) has decided not to sell the building to the Town Council. In doing so, MDDC has clearly shown that it does not exercise fairness and transparency across its towns and it has a blatant disregard for the needs of Crediton and its residents.

Unfortunately, the Town Council has no more cards to play. We have taken advice from the National Association of Local Councils, Solicitors and we've written to our MP asking for help, all to no avail. We are now out of options. So, we must focus on moving forward and what happens next.

The good news is that the buyer of the building has said that they would like the Council to stay in situ. So, we will start negotiations and explore whether this will be a financially viable option. We are forever mindful that the building is used by a range of local groups and organisations, all of which play an important role in the well-being of our town, and wherever possible we don't want to lose any of these important services.

Sadly, this is not the case for CHAT (Churches Housing Action Team) who has decided, due to the uncertainty over the future of the building, to relocate its Outreach Surgery. For further information regarding the new service, please contact CHAT on 01884 255606.


