Hanging baskets – reducing costs and environmental impact!

At the budget workshops held in November, the importance of floral displays divided members of the public, with some seeing them as low priority and costly and others rating the way they brighten up the town as one of the highest priorities. With this feedback in mind, at the beginning of June you will see 50 hanging baskets go up around the town, however, this year the focus is going to be perennials and grasses which are pollinator and insect friendly. Not only will these be beneficial for biodiversity, but these plants will only need watering once per week, which will half the watering costs and, with the climate emergency in mind, reduce the total journeys made to Crediton by the contractor.
