Crediton Neighbourhood Plan

If you've been reading our newsletters for the last few years, you will know about the progress of the Neighbourhood Plan but, you may have been wondering where it has got to. Here's an update for everyone, whether recent arrival or longstanding resident.

The plan covers eight policy areas: Development, Community and Facilities, Town Centre, Transport, Sustainability, Employment, Heritage and Environment.

Our plan must be in conformity with the National Planning Policy Framework and the Mid Devon District Council Local Plan. It has been examined by an independent planning inspector who has found it meets these basic conditions subject to some minor modifications which have been done.

Mid Devon District Council cabinet will review the plan in July and it can then proceed to a referendum which is expected to be in early October. Crediton electors will be asked: Do you want.

Mid Devon District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Crediton to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?

If the majority vote is in favour, the plan will be formally 'made' by the district council and will become a legal planning document alongside the Local Plan and other planning documents.
