Our youth work team has enjoyed a fantastic summer with young people across Credition. Alongside our regular project night and girls' group activities, we hosted eight young people for work experience. They joined in with a range of youth work activities and even created a fundraising video – look out for it on our social media channels. A highlight for many was taking part in Credition Food Festival and giving something back to the local community.

Events and Activities

In partnership with Community Alcohol Partnership (CAP), we ran a Youth Fringe event in Newcombes Meadow Park, featuring graffiti art, games, zorbs and sumo suits, with support from our friends at Space Youth Services.

Thanks to the Credition Heart Project, young people also took part in two creative workshops: giant flower making and drumming. To round off the summer, Credition Youth Voice ran two fun-packed activity days, followed by a screening of Rio in partnership with Films for Credition.

Skills and Learning

Twenty young people attended a First Aid course, initiated by Credition Youth Voice as part of our commitment to providing practical skills and learning opportunities. They learned CPR, how to respond to injuries, and how to use a defibrillator.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN DEVON IS CHANGING

The Government has recently decided that the current county and district council system will be replaced by four new unitary councils from April 2028. A unitary council will provide all local government services in one organisation, with town and parish councils continuing to provide their existing services.



Existing councils across Devon are working together through the Future Devon programme to plan for the next steps. For now, council services will continue as normal. Crediton Town Council will keep residents updated as more information becomes available and as the transition progresses over the coming years.

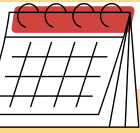
