About us:

Following consultation with Crediton residents which identified a need for activities for young people, Crediton Town Council embarked on an ambitious programme for youth work provision. Over the last 12 months we have been delivering a programme of detached youth work, alongside outreach in schools. We are now at an exciting point in our development with the opening of our new Youth Club, in the Old Landscore School building (also known previously as Early Birds). Our Youth Club will be open on Wednesday and Thursday after school for years 6, 7 and 8 and in the evening for young people aged 13+.

There is currently one Lead Youth Worker in post and one sessional youth worker who have been delivering detached youth work and outreach. We are expanding our team now to open our youth club on Wednesdays and Thursdays for an after school and evening youth club on both days. Our young people have given us lots of ideas about the types of activities they would like to be at the Youth Club, these include arts, crafts, music including organising gigs and open mic nights, indoor and outdoor gardening, sustainability, developing a small outdoor games area, sewing and textiles (including cushions and curtains), cookery and baking, board games, DND, film nights and trips out.

About the Sessional Youth Work posts:

These youth work posts will be centre based, at Old Landscore School. We have vacancies across all our sessions. You can apply for just one session or combine sessions to create a more substantial post – please indicate on the application form the minimum and maximum number of sessions you are interested in, and whether Wednesday, Thursday, or both.

If you cannot commit weekly but would like to get involved on a monthly or project-by-project basis, get in touch and let us know your ideas. If you would like to get involved but do not want to commit to a paid post, why not consider volunteering – we are a supportive team and can offer you a great training package. Our sessions are:
